		And here how does it work? Here are these documents which you already scripted before. You can import it. You can see it is some kind of text, documents, or it would be also some kind of PDF documents and papers. So sometimes it can be schedules or maybe also some kind of videos.

		Here how does it work? This is the text and you are able to put some kind of remarks and codes in every second of the text that you think is related to one idea which you are

		After finish the text coding, you will be able to browse your research information in this kind of tree. This tree includes all the codes which you inserted before which might be the main topics and the hierarchy of your research.
		So right now you browse each topic of them very easily. Just double click it and it will show you who was talking about

		I think it's very helpful to use this software to organise your data and I think the idea of the data is very good and very helpful for people who are dealing with an amount of information gathered through the interviews and something like that. It's just to rely on the full text and it's very helpful for us.
